## Eligibility for Membership.

The Home Office requires that applications for membership be 'supported' by two current members of the Club and that the applicant serves a minimum probationary period: six months for those who do not hold a FAC and are not members of an approved Club and three months for those who do and/or are.

(Note: Because of the seasonal nature of the Club's activities, our Club Rules require that the applicant attends a stipulated number of events. This may extend the Home Office's probationary period.)

In the normal course of events an application for membership will be considered by the Committee at their next meeting and, if accepted, probationary membership granted. While shooting as a probationary member the applicant will be subject to scrutiny in respect of firearm handling and range safety and will be required to pay the range fees ruling at the time and for any Club ammunition used.

Following the necessary probationary period the Committee will confirm or otherwise the application for full membership. If this is granted the applicant will then be liable for the balance of the membership subscription on receipt of which they will be issued with a membership card. The Surrey Police will also be informed that the applicant has been accepted as a member.

Note: Guests are required by the Police to supply the information over and sign the declaration, whether or not they subsequently apply for membership. Guests may shoot only on designated guest days and under supervision.
